**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK: "ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT"**

Every Tuesday from 1:00p.m. to 5:00p.m. we have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. It is imperative that someone always be present in Adoration. Our late Pope John Paul II called the whole people of God to a personal relationship with Jesus, our Saviour, in the Blessed Sacrament. Without coming before Him in quiet moments of prayer, we diminish our faith in His Real Presence. It is by taking time out to be with Him in the Blessed Sacrament that this relationship with Our Lord begins to increase, and grow and blossom. It is we who have the authentic answer for a personal relationship with Jesus, our Saviour because in going before Him in the Blessed Sacrament we go before Him who is with us in person. Adoration builds a community. The Eucharist is the Sacrament of Unity, unifying His people. Today a growing number of people feel alienated from the Church. They feel lost among the multitudes. Adoration helps people feel more personally involved with Christ, His Church and the people of God. Through the intimacy of prayer with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, one experiences the personal love of the Saviour. Through this personal love, one is more able to grasp the reality that they are one with the whole Body of Christ. World Peace and Vocations would be two intentions to remember at Adoration along with your own personal needs.
